Historic & Garden Districts: Sterling Grove, Nickerson & Downtown Districts, Freetown-Port Rico District, Elmhurst Park, The Saints Streets, & Les Jardins de Mouton, The University of Louisiana at Lafayette, Arbolada 1920's Mediterranean Tudor development, The Oil Center Cultural Historic District, Girard Park, Bendel Gardens, Greenbriar and Whittington Park Garden Estates.

Lafayette's azalea trail features all the Southern favorite varieties of Lavender Formosa, President Clay, G. G. Gerbing, Pride of Mobile, George L. Tabor, Judge Salomon, and Red Formosa evergreen azaleas. Come visit the gardens of the deep south for a springtime "Floral Mardi Gras" late February through mid March.


